Our Curriculum:

Mathematics: This term we are focusing on fractions, decimals, multiplication and division. The children will learn equivalent fractions and find fractions of different quantities. They will also consolidate their knowledge of written addition and subtraction strategies, and mental multiplication and division. This will be supplemented by work on describing positions on a 2D grid as coordinates.

English: In English this term, the children will read a story about a volcano linked to their history topic. The children will create play scripts and a diary recount based on the story. The children will also write a procedure of what to do in the event of an earthquake.

Religious Education: The children will learn about prayer. Their second topic is 'Exploring Easter' as a story of betrayal and trust.

Science: Electricity: Children will construct simple series circuits, trying different components. The electricity unit will be enhanced by an all-day workshop where children will have lots of opportunities to carry out experiments on electrical circuit boards.

States of Matter: Children explore the similarities and differences between the three states of matter: solids, liquids, and gases. They will learn how to use a thermometer and investigate matter changing from one state to another.

Computing: This term, children will unleash their creativity by designing 3D games using Purple Mash's 2DIY 3D tool. They'll also explore storytelling through Adventure Story planning with Purple Mash 2Connect, developing their skills in logic, design, and communication.

Topic (Geography): The children will be studying earthquakes, volcanoes and mountains in Geography.

Music: Year 4 will be continuing the Wider Opportunities Music scheme. Lessons are on a Thursday and all children must have their violin, viola or cello in school on this day.

Physical Education: This term the children will be taking part in Sportshall Athletics and gymnastics.

Art and Design: This term the children will experiment with water colours and complete a painting of a volcano inspired by Margaret Godfrey.

Design and Technology: Children will be using electrical systems to create a light up volcano.

Relationships and Health Education (PSHE): Children will explore the themes of safe relationships and living in the wider world - Economic Wellbeing: Aspirations work and career.

French: Children will study the topics 'colours' and 'months of the year'.

Spring Term Focus Themes

What on Earth has happened?

"What on Earth has Happened?" takes children on a thrilling exploration of the Earth's dynamic forces, focusing on earthquakes, volcanoes, and mountains in their geography unit. Linked to their art studies, they create vibrant paintings of volcanoes, inspired by the work of artist Margaret Godfrey. In Design Technology, they combine creativity with engineering by constructing a "Light up the Volcano" project, integrating electrical systems to bring their models to life. The focus text 'Firework Maker's Daughter' by Philip Pullman adds a magical element to their learning. Children also practice an earthquake procedure and participate in a drama Volcanoes and Earthquakes workshop, helping them to understand and react to these powerful natural events in an engaging, hands-on way.

Purple Mash: Children have access to this online platform at home, where they can enjoy educational games and use resources to enhance their learning. This **will not** be used for homework this year, but will be used within school and available for children to use at home.

Home Learning

Spellings: Children will be given an age-appropriate spelling list every **Monday** in their Spelling Record Book and will be tested the following **Monday**.

Reading: In order to be competent readers, children need to read regularly at home and school. Parents/Carers are asked to encourage their children to read regularly and to read for pleasure.

We ask parents/carers to sign and date Reading Records every time you hear your child read (we expect a minimum of **four** entries/comments a week). This is an ideal opportunity to question your child on their understanding of the text, to improve their comprehension skills and vocabulary. Reading Records must be brought into school on **Thursday**, for teachers to sign and monitor. Children will be given opportunities to change their reading book every week.

Library (KS2 only): Children will have the opportunity to change their library book once a week. Year 4 library afternoon is **Thursday**- Please ensure that your child brings their library book on this day if they wish to change it.

Maths (Year 1 to Year 6): Children will be given a weekly home learning task in Maths, to be given out every **Friday**, to consolidate the learning that has taken place in school during the week. This needs to be returned to their child's class teacher by the following **Wednesday**.

Multiplication Tables (Year 1 to Year 6): Children have got access to TT Rockstars, a maths programme focusing on multiplication tables <u>link</u> Please encourage your child to use this online programme on a regular basis. If you do not know your child's username and password please contact <u>helpdesk@saintwilfrids.wigan.sch.uk</u> stating your child's full name and class.

Home Learning Project: Children will be set a Home Learning Project, related to their termly focus theme. This is usually a practical task, which families can work with children on together and share in school.

Additional Information:

Playground Equipment and Games: Children are not allowed to use any of the playground equipment or bring in balls to play with before or after school. Also, children are not permitted to use bikes or scooters on the school grounds. This is for health and safety reasons. Children must not enter the school car park or climb on the blue railings.

PE Uniform: PE lessons will take place on **Tuesday.** Swimming lessons will take place on **Monday.** Children will be expected to attend school in PE uniform on their PE day. This consists of a sky-blue T-shirt, school jumper, cardigan or hoody, and navy/black shorts, or navy/black leggings, or navy/black joggers, and a pair of dark-coloured trainers (no bright colours please). Children are also encouraged to bring a rainproof jacket for outdoor use in wet weather.

Handwriting Pens (KS2 only): Teachers will issue a 'Pen License' if and when your child is ready to make the transition from pencil to pen.

Parking: Please be reminded that parking on the school premises is for staff only between 7am and 4.30pm. Please be respectful to residents when parking in the local community.

Pets: Dogs **are not** permitted on the school grounds, without formal consent.

Attendance and Punctuality: Good attendance is crucial in your child's education. If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, please notify the office staff.

School Uniform: Please ensure that children wear the correct school uniform and look smart. This includes black shoes. We strongly encourage you to have your child's name clearly marked or labelled in all items of clothing. Please ensure that your child comes to school with a coat. We encourage hair accessories, such as hair bands and bobbles, to be consistent with the colour of the uniform e.g., sky blue, navy, grey or black. Long hair should be tied back.

Earrings: Children **are not** permitted to wear earrings in school. This is for health and safety reasons.

Water bottles: Children are encouraged to drink water during the school day to keep them hydrated. They may bring in a plastic water bottle (not a 'Stanley-style' cup with straw), preferably clear, with their name labelled on it. They should take it home regularly to be washed. Children can refill bottles in school.

Snacks: Children may bring in a snack of either toast or a piece of fruit for morning playtime. Other items such as cakes, biscuits, crackers, sweets, cereal or fruit bars are not permitted at playtime. Please be aware that there are children in school with nut allergies. Therefore, can you please ensure that your child does not bring any items containing nuts into school as part of their packed lunch or snack. Please note that this may include some cereal bars.

Medication: If your child requires medication such as inhalers, please ensure that you child's class teacher is provided with medication that is within its expiry date and is clearly labelled. You will be required to complete a medical form from the school office.

Mobile Phones (Year 5 & 6 only): Whilst children are not permitted mobile phones in school, children in Upper Key Stage 2, who walk to school, may bring a mobile phone to keep them safe if parents and carers allow this. On entering the school premises, children **must** turn their mobile phone off, and mobile phones will be collected in during registration and stored securely, and will be returned to children at the end of the school day.

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
